Feather River College Job Fair 2013

The College, Career, and Transfer Fair held on September 18, 2013 at Feather River College in Quincy was a wonderful success! With the theme "Hack Your Life," high school students were given opportunity to interview representatives from careers and educational institutions, listen to guest speakers, and talk to a panel of recent high school graduates about the choices a student makes after high school and how that can impact their lives. Representatives from 40 colleges and Universities were in attendance as well as major employers and vocational schools from California and Nevada. Business & Career Center Staff from Plumas and Lassen were on site to explain program services. The high school students were separated into three groups and led on a route between three stations, in the Gymnasium, where the BCN booth was located, students were asked to interview presenters then meet with an advisor to discuss what they had learned. In the afternoon the area was opened up for the college students and members of the public to attend. BCN staff was kept very busy answering questions and networking with other presenters, vocational schools, colleges, and universities. The event was a very busy, productive, and enjoyable time.




